

## ЗАДАНИЕ ПО АНАЛИЗУ НЕИЗВЕСТНОГО ЯЗЫКА

Дан начальный фрагмент текста на языке X. Кроме того, к тексту прилагаются:

1. Свободный перевод на английский язык
2. Поморфемный перевод (гlossы)
3. Примечания к поморфемному переводу

Вам необходимо полностью разобраться в глоссах к тексту и детально изучить грамматику языка X в той степени, в которой позволяет имеющийся объем материала, – фактически стать экспертом по данному языку в этих границах. Нужно быть готовым отвечать на вопросы о языке X типа тех, которые разбирались на протяжении семестра в отношении различных языков мира. Для подтверждения Ваших ответов на вопросы необходимо будет сослаться на релевантные фрагменты текста.

### Исходный фрагмент текста

#### ADRIAN WARMAČA

(1) Huk siñuras huk warmata uywasqa wasimpi yanapanampaq, Adriyan sutiuyuqta. (2) Siñuraqa kamačiq ĩapa imata čay warmačata, (3) warmačañataq mana imatapas ruwaqču aĭintaqa. #### THE BOY ADRIÁN

<sup>1</sup> Once a woman kept a boy named Adrian in her house to help her.<sup>2</sup> The woman ordered the boy to do everything,<sup>3</sup> but the boy never did anything well.<sup>4</sup> Every time he selected and ground wheat, he selected and ground it little by little<sup>5</sup> and he threw a part of it away into the well beside the millstone.<sup>6</sup> He also threw away food after eating only part.<sup>7</sup> The boy just played and played every day without ever being obedient.<sup>8</sup> He went to steal money and toys from his neighbors' houses,<sup>9</sup> and then hid them behind the millstone, to play with each time his mistress left.

be thus, do thus + subord. vb. marker<sup>4</sup> + 3d pers. sing. NOTES

1. Before bilabial consonants the nasal *-n* of various affixes regularly becomes *-m* by assimilation.
2. The entire noun phrase is in apposition to *warma-ta* 'boy': '. . . boy . . . Adrian name possessor' = '. . . boy . . . Adrian by name.'
3. Accusative or object suffix *-ta* is often used to derive adverbs from nominal stems, but especially from adjectival stems.
4. This subordinate verb marker indicates that its subject is the same as that of the main clause. It can often be translated into English by a participle in *-ing* or by *having* + past participle.
5. Simple present tense replaces other tenses in story telling when the context is unambiguous.
6. It is usually not possible to translate this suffix into English. In many cases the meaning is very idiomatic: *rima-* 'to speak', but *rima-yku-* 'to greet'. According to Parker (1969:67), it may indicate cordiality, severity, fear, surprise, and so on, depending on context.
7. The form *-yka-* is the allomorph of *-yku-* before *-mu* and few other suffixes. There are several affixes in which *-a* and *-u* alternate in identical morphological environments. The phonological motivation for this alternation is unclear.
8. The form *-ka-* is the allomorph of *-ku-* (mediopassive) before *-mu* and a few other suffixes. Cf. note 7.
9. This subordinate verb marker always indicates that the subject of the verb is a different one from that of the main verb. It usually may be translated into English by a phrase beginning with "if," "when," or "because."
